

# **Get Training To Support You**

Scouting is a volunteer led program and the Council has the training and tools to help you along the way. Training will give you fresh ideas, a place to talk to other Scout parents, and the knowledge and information you need to carry out the Scouting program. The required trainings needed to be a Cub Leader are available at my.scouting.org.

We take youth protection very seriously. Youth Protection Training is required for Scout Leaders and for adults accompanying youth at events. Learn more about Youth Protection at danbeard.org/youthprotection.

## **How to complete Youth Protection Training?**

- **1.)** Visit **my.scouting.org** and click "create an account." You will receive a temporary ID number to proceed.
- **2.)** Once logged in, click the **Youth Protection Training** icon (on the right side) to access the BSA Learn Center.
- **3.)** Scroll down and click Youth Protection Training. Click Launch Course button to start the training.

\*Note: If you are registering as an adult, your BSA Membership ID # will be issued after you complete training and turn in your Adult Application. Print out a copy of your Youth Protection Certificate and turn it in with your Adult Application. When your ID # is issued, enter it into your My Account settings on my.scouting.org.



# **How Cub Scouting Works**

The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

- Your child is a member of a DEN, consisting of 5-8 children, similar in age, who typically meet once a week with a Den Leader, usually a parent.
- All of the DENS make up the PACK.
- The PACK meets once a month with the Cubmaster, with all the other **DENS** in attendance. At the **PACK** meeting, you will have fun activities and have the opportunity to engage with other **DENS**.
- Your PACK is part of the Dan Beard Council, Boy Scouts of America, which serves over 30,000 youth in Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky.

# **Scouting Results**

209,

Last year alone, **local Scouts** officially recorded 209,191 service hours on community service projects for local communities here in Southwest Ohio and Northern Kentucky. **55%** 

Prior Scouts are 55% more likely than non-Scouts to have held a leadership position at their place of work.

76%

Prior Scouts are 76% more likely than non-Scouts to have held a leadership position in their local community.

53%

Scouts are 53% more likely than non-Scouts to have **provided** service to others and to the community, and demonstrated leadership traits.

# **Cub Scout Uniform**

The Cub Scout uniform is an important part of being a Cub Scout. Wearing it lets people know that the wearer is part of the Boy Scouts of America, in addition to their Den and Pack! The official uniform should be worn to Den meetings, Pack meetings,



and any special Scouting activities. When you wear the full Cub Scout uniform, it shows you are a member of the team.

# **Lion, Tiger, Wolf and Bear Cub Scouts**

The Lion Cub Scouts uniform includes a blue t-shirt with the Lion logo and optional cap. The official uniform for Tiger, Wolf and Bear Cub Scouts include the blue Cub Scout pants or shorts and shirt with insignia for your rank. Each rank has its own cap, neckerchief and slide in the rank colors and a belt buckle to be worn with the blue Cub Scout belt.

# **Cub Scout Pack Organization**



## **Pack Committee**

The Pack Committee members perform administrative functions for the Cub Scout Pack.



## **Chartered Organization Representative**

The Chartered Organization Representative is the direct contact between the Scouting unit and the chartered organization (typically your church, school or service club).



#### **Committee Chair**

The Committee Chair presides all Pack Committee meetings. They help recruit adult leaders and leads the Pack.



#### **Cubmaster**

The Cubmaster helps plan and carry out the pack program with the help of the Pack Committee. They also emcee the monthly pack meeting and attend the Pack Leaders' meeting.



### **Den Leader**

The Den Leader leads the Den at weekly Den and monthly Pack meetings. They also attend the monthly Pack Leaders' meeting.
