What is the Parent Landing Page?

The Parent Landing Page (see below or back) is a digital page that will display when parents scan the QR code found on the Join Scout Night flyer their child received at their school. Our goal with this page is to provide more in-depth information about your pack so that parents have more information to join Cub Scouts. We are personalizing this page for your Pack, so we'll need some of your Pack details.

1

Fill out the Online Form before the deadline of **July 25, 2021!** We are asking each Pack to provide (see graphic on left and backside of flyer):

- 1: Pack meeting day and week (*third Tuesday*)
- 2: Pack meeting location (*Name & Address*)
- 3: Primary membership contact for the unit
- 4: Den meeting frequency (*1x/week or 1x/2 weeks*)
- 5: Den meetings days of the week if set (*Lions, Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos*). On flyer, this will be listed by grade, not rank.
- 6: Calendar of Pack events for next 30 days after School Night
- 7: Cost of pack dues, and what is included

Provide your District Executive with your Pack's sign-up dates by **August 13, 2021** and we will add your Join Scout Nights to this form through one final posting in mid-August.
